Welcome to Spring 2023 We persevered through the Fall semester with in-person classes, and the learning experience for our students was rich and engaging. THANK YOU to our students, teachers, and staff for their dedication and to the families and businesses in our community for supporting our programs.

During the Fall semester, we had a visit to the Green Valley Center from Congresswoman Zoe Lofgren. Being new to Watsonville, she wanted an overview of the school and spoke with students about immigration, English Language classes, Citizenship, High School Diploma/High School Equivalency, and Medical classes. Congresswoman Lofgren seemed impressed and happy with Adult Education.

Health and safety is a concern of all students and staff. Teachers are being instructed to keep their doors locked. Staff and students need to be aware of their surroundings. We continue to follow the California Department of Public Health (CDHP) guidance to ensure our students and staff stay healthy and safe.

The cosmetology class will start a new cohort in January. Sign up today! This is the only Cosmetology Program in Santa Cruz County and we have two instructors. This 1000 hour program will lead to the opportunity and test for the State license and work in our community. Our program has State approval from the Board of Barbering and Cosmetology in Sacramento. Visit our new salon/classroom at our Watsonville Downtown Center (WDC) on Rodriguez Street. For language learners, we continue to develop Integrated Education and Training programs that help prepare language learners with workforce skills as students acquire English language skills. We are working to help our students transition to Cabrillo College through our partnership with the GOAL (Greater Opportunities for Adult Learners) Consortium. Our Health career options are strong and expanding and we have a track record of helping our graduates attain employment with opportunities for growth. Check out our health career training programs: Certified Nurse Assistant, Clinical Medical Assistant, Dental Assistant, Pharmacy Technician, Administrative Medical Assistant, and Personal Care Assistant. All of us need health care – be part of the solution! Emerge yourself and get involved with your education. The GED is a four-part examination that measures a person's general educational development in comparison to that of high school graduates.

Examinations are given in English and Spanish.

Students may sign up online to take one or more of the four GED examinations: Language Arts, Mathematical Reasoning, Social Studies and Science.

Students can prepare for the GED exams by enrolling in GED classes at Watsonville/ Aptos/ Santa Cruz Adult Education.

PROGRAMS: Watsonville/Aptos/Santa Cruz Adult Education offers instructional programs in English and Spanish to assist students in completing their secondary education. The programs are:

- **HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA** (English only) fully accredited (A-G) program for students wishing to complete a high school diploma. Classes offered include: Applied Arts, English, Health, Social Studies, Math, Science and Visual Arts.
- **HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY (HSE)** (English or Spanish) Preparation program for students studying for the GED and the HiSET equivalency test.
- **TRANSITIONS...PATHWAYS TO EMPLOYMENT OR COLLEGE** (English ONLY) offered to students near completion of their GED/HiSET or HSD who are ready to transition to college or a specific career technical skill based program.
- **CREDIT RECOVERY** (English ONLY), a program designed for high school students to make up credits.
- **WORKKEYS CURRICULUM** (English ONLY), a program designed to teach students what they need to know to pass the WorkKeys exam. The WorkKeys exam is offered at the Green Valley Center, see page 20.

An individualized course of study based on assessment, schedule, and goals will be designed for each student enabling learners to earn their high school diploma or pass the GED/HiSET exams while improving their skills for college or career training. Courses are offered in teacher-directed classrooms aligned with the Common Core State Standards (CCSS).

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS: All students (except credit recovery) must meet the following criteria to enroll in classes and maintain ongoing enrollment:

- Complete assessments and attend one to one counseling appointment before beginning class.
- Maintain attendance:
 - **MORNING CLASSES** 9 hours per week minimum attendance with demonstrated progress
 - **EVENING CLASSES** 6 hours per week minimum attendance with demonstrated progress
- Sign and adhere to our School Code of Conduct and Internet Use Policies

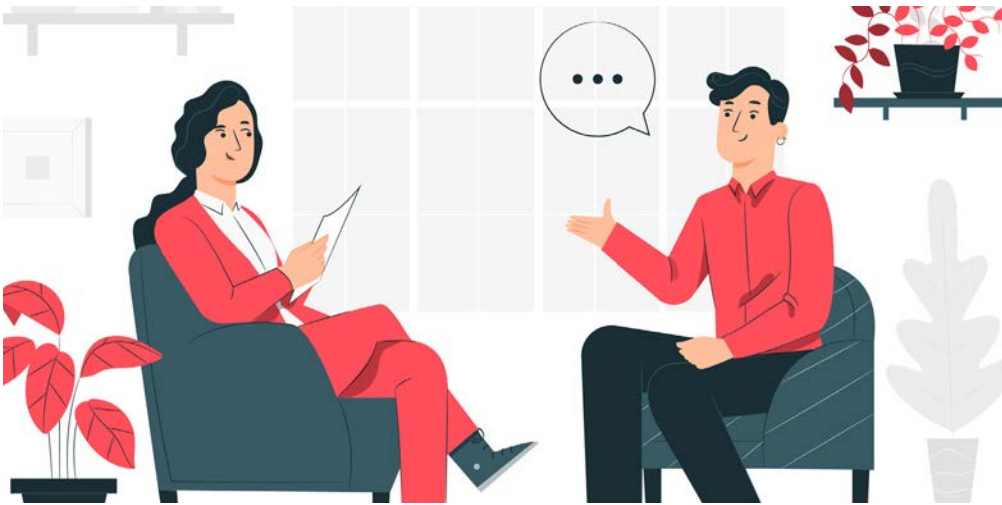

CITIZENSHIP INFORMATION

Applicants for U.S. citizenship who are 50 years of age or older and have been lawful permanent residents for 20 years, or who are 55 years of age or older and have been permanent residents for 15 years, are exempt from the English examination and may take the examination in the language of choice at the Office of Immigration and Naturalization. Citizenship application assistance is available in class. Citizenship and Citizenship/ESL classes are offered at different times and days. Students can qualify to participate if they have been permanent residents of The United States and according to age.

INFORMACION DE CIUDADANÍA

COSMETOLOGY ❖

The cosmetology program will offer the required training to obtain a California Cosmetology License. Cosmetology encompasses the study and beautification of hair, skin and nails. 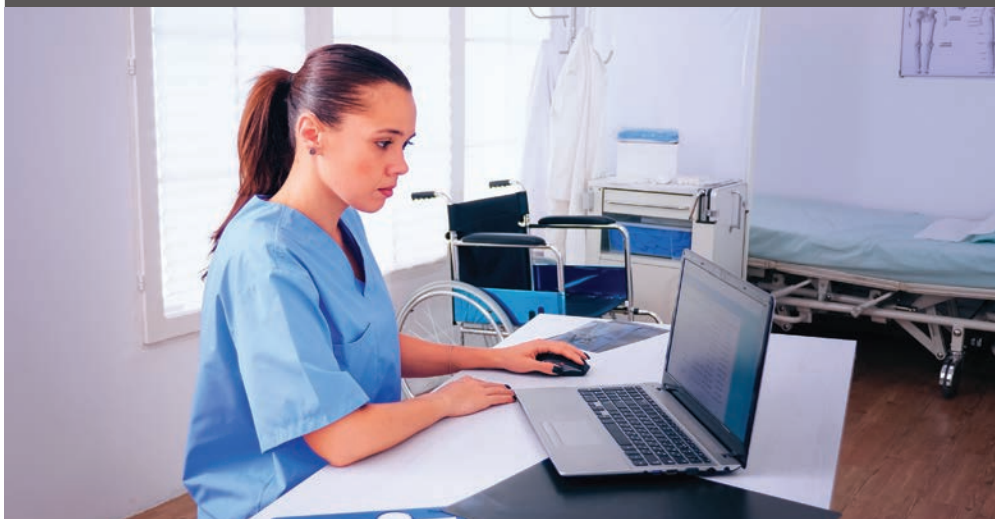

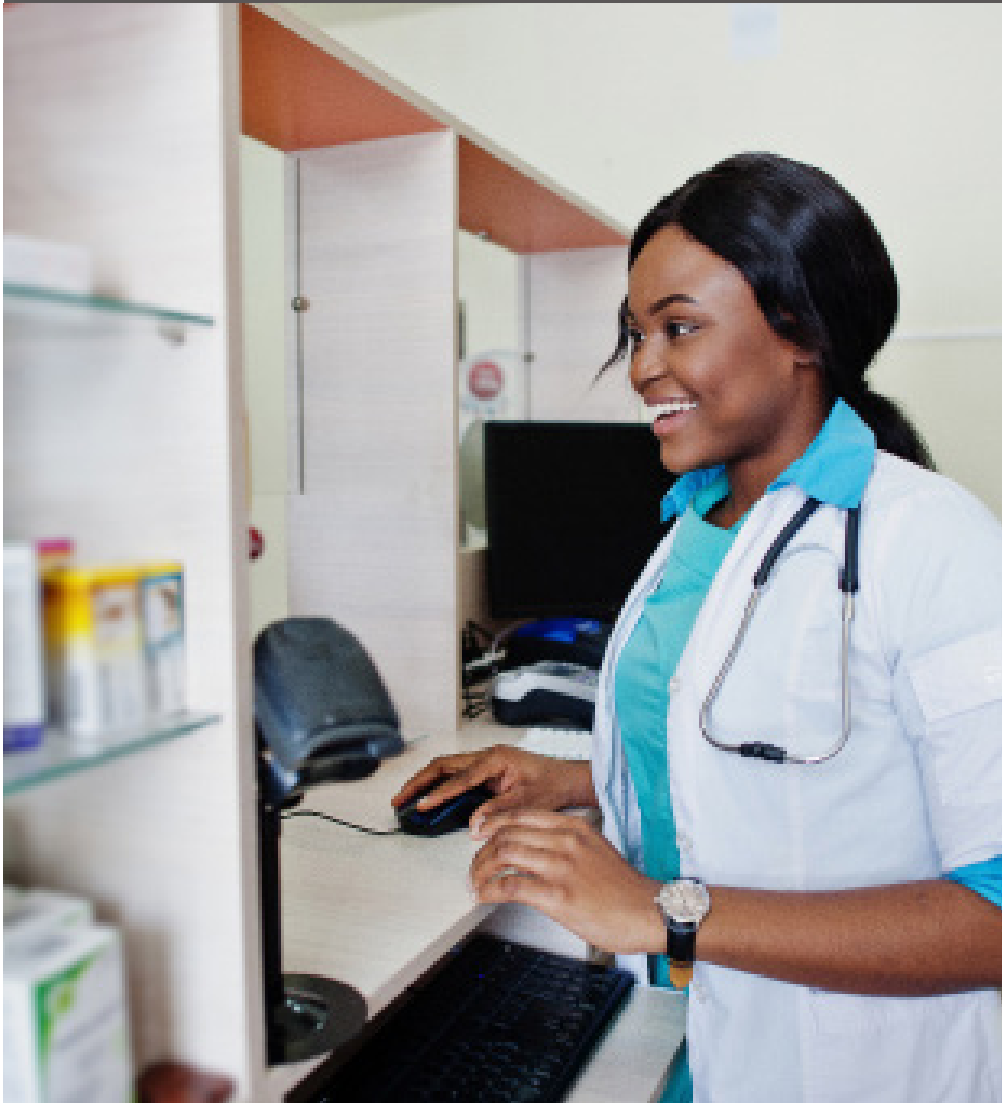

Watsonville/Aptos/Santa Cruz Adult Education celebrated 94 successful years in the community! The school was founded in 1928 and it originally was designated as an “Evening High School.” Watsonville has a long and proud tradition of welcoming immigrants, from the Serb and Croatian farmers who built the orchard industries in the 20’s, to the Portuguese and Sicilian fisherman, Japanese truck farmers and Chinese strawberry and railroad workers of the 20’s and 30’s, the Filipino “dollar-a-day” farm workers of the 30’s, through the last half century of Latinx or Hispanic immigrants who have worked the canneries and the fields.

In 2015, Watsonville/Aptos Education expanded to include Santa Cruz and now encompasses the entire county. Students are also served in Monterey County. It is a division of the Pajaro Valley Unified School District and continues to expand and grow, and thus, becoming a great resource to the community.

In 2016, Watsonville/Aptos/Santa Cruz Adult Education was recognized as the “Organization of the Year” by the Pajaro Valley Chamber of Commerce and Agriculture. We are very humbled by this recognition. This special award means so very much to the staff and students of the community.

In 2020, we experienced the COVID 19 pandemic and continued to serve students virtually. For 2021-2022 we started back to in-person instruction and will continue in 2022-2023. Please join us!



In May 2022, graduation took place in the Mello Center with 5 students graduating with a High School Diploma. We also had 20 GED graduates and 65 earned their medical certificates. Watsonville/Aptos/Santa Cruz Adult Education is a strong adult school provider in Santa Cruz County and parts of Monterey County.

In the 1960's, Federal Adult Education legislation expanded Adult Education funding and the role in response to addressing the inequities of educational disadvantages of millions of adults as part of the antipoverty program and the civil rights movement. At that time, functional illiterates made up approximately 14 percent of California's population over the age of twenty-five. It is now estimated that 25 percent of our population is under-skilled. Watsonville/Aptos/Santa Cruz Adult Education is a Western Association of Schools and Colleges accredited High School. The 70's marked the birth of competency based education for EL (English Learners), Adult Basic Education, and Secondary Education in Adult Education and accountability in the 80's and 90's. Preparing students for better jobs, to be better parents, involved citizens, and informed consumers, has been added to WASCAE's Mission. Health careers are in demand and WASCAE continues to expand these course offerings. The Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) Program has been very popular as well as the Clinical Medical Assistant Program. We also offer Continuing Education Units for Certified Nurse Assistant and Dental Assistant Program which are necessary occupations in the Health Field. Join us today!

REFUND POLICY

If for some reason class attendance is impossible, **please bring the original receipt** to the Green Valley office at least **24 hours before the class begins**. No refunds will be approved once the class has started except by the administrator or if the class is cancelled. Upon presenting your original receipt and the refund request form, a check will be mailed to you within 6 to 8 weeks. A \$10.00 processing fee will be charged for refunds. Textbooks and supplies are nonrefundable. There is a \$25.00 fee for returned checks. Refunds are processed per semester, *only in the semester the class was scheduled*.

SMOKING POLICY

UNIFORM COMPLAINT PROCEDURE

The Governing board recognizes that the district is responsible for ensuring that it complies with state and federal laws and regulations governing educational programs. The District shall follow uniform complaint procedures when addressing complaints alleging unlawful discrimination based on ethnic group identification, religion, age, gender, color, or physical or mental disability in any program or activity that receives or benefits from state financial assistance. The district shall also follow uniform complaint procedures when addressing complaints alleging failure to comply with state or federal law in adult basic education, consolidated categorical aid programs, migrant education, vocational education, child care and development programs, child nutrition programs and special education programs. (Title 5, Section 4621)

The Board encourages the early, informal resolution of complaints at the site level whenever possible. Upon receipt of a written complaint from an individual, public agency or organization, uniform complaint procedures shall be initiated. The Superintendent or designee shall distribute full information about these procedures. The Board recognizes that a neutral mediator can often suggest an early compromise that is agreeable to all parties in a dispute. In accordance with uniform complaint procedures, whenever all parties to a complaint agree to try resolving their problem through mediation, the Superintendent or designee shall initiate a mediation process before beginning a formal compliance investigation. The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that mediation results are consistent with state and federal laws and regulations. (Title 5, Section 4631).

The Board acknowledges and respects student and employee rights to privacy. Discrimination complaints shall be investigated in a manner that protects the confidentiality of the parties and the facts. This includes keeping the identity of the complainant confidential except to the extent necessary to carry out the investigation or proceedings, as determined by the Superintendent or designee on a case-by-case basis. (Title 5, Section 4621). The Board prohibits retaliation in any form for the filing of a complaint, the reporting of instances of discrimination or participation in complaint procedures. Such participation shall not in any way affect the status, grades or word assignments of the complainant.
